Introduction

The Professional Masters in Social Work was developed for graduates who are interested in pursuing a career in social work. It is a two year, full-time graduate course providing accredited professional training in social work. The course provides generic social work training that includes two 14-week practice placements in a range of social-work settings.

The course provides an integrated academic and social work practise curriculum that meets the standards set by CORU (which regulates the social work profession in Ireland), and is widely recognised internationally.

You will undertake modules covering a range of social work theories, methods and skills that are applicable to social work practice. You study a range of issues and problems that come to social work departments and the responses to these problems including, for example, child protection and welfare, domestic violence, sexual violence and abuse, mental health, disabilities, safeguarding of older people, addictions, crime and punishment, and health and medical related problems.

Programme Highlight

With a long history of providing professional social work training in Ireland, our Masters programme will equip you to work in a range of settings in an exciting and rewarding career. There is currently great demand for professionally qualified social workers to work in a variety of fields both in Ireland and internationally. Our graduates are working for both statutory and non-governmental organisations in areas such as child welfare and protection, medical social work, community mental health, community development and criminal justice.

Applicant Profile

- The programme is intended for applicants with an honours degree in Social Work or Social Policy. Where Social Policy or Social Work are not available as an undergraduate subject, other Social Science degrees may be considered as long as they offer sufficient Social Policy or Social Work equivalent modules. Contact the school for more information.
- Interviews are conducted in the second stage of selection for entry – these may be conducted by Audio-visual link, Skype or Zoom.
- Candidates must have completed at least 420 hours of relevant paid or voluntary employment experience by the time they commence the course, including at least 250 hours before 1st of February on year of admission.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 7.0 (with no score lower than 6.5 in any component), or equivalent.
