MASTER OF LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE PATHWAY SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE, PLANNING & ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY (ONE TO FOUR TRIMESTERS IN DURATION)

This programme is an entry route for applicants who do not have an undergraduate degree in Landscape Architecture to fulfil the direct entry criteria for the Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA). The MLA Pathway programme provides an entry route for applicants who wish to pursue a career in Landscape Architecture.

To enter the MLA Pathway programme, suitable applicants will be required to go through an interview process and to submit a portfolio to demonstrate their interest in the field of Landscape Architecture. Following the outcome of the interview process, the applicant will agree to undertake an individual curriculum of up to 120 credits from the existing modules of the BSc in Landscape Architecture (BHARCH005) degree. These modules will be determined by Negotiated Learning Agreement with the School on an individual basis. Students must successfully complete all required modules to be eligible to progress onto the Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA).

On the MLA Pathway programme, the student will accumulate the knowledge required to register to the MLA programme, from basic drawing and spatial design skills to more complex landscape architectural design solutions, individual interpretation and critical thinking about landscape issues. Depending on prior learning students will take modules from within the discipline of Landscape Architecture such as History and Theory of Landscape Architecture; Landscape Ecology, Landscape Materials and Construction all of which are offered as part of the BHARCH005 BSc (Landscape Architecture) programme.

Additional information on our Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA) at UCD Landscape Architecture

This two-year 120-ECTS credit programme is recognised by EFLA (Europe) as fulfilling the academic requirements of professional education in landscape architecture. The MLA equips students to deal with complex landscape design problems in challenging contexts. Through studio projects, academic writing and practical experiment it develops professional capacities while placing equal emphasis on research and critical enquiry and situating landscape architecture within its broader field of disciplines and influences.





If you wish to pursue a career in the field of Landscape Architecture, but if you do not have the BSc Landscape Architecture degree from UCD or an equivalent degree to fulfil the direct entry criteria for the Master of Landscape Architecture Degree Programme (MLA) at UCD, this programme will give you the opportunity to receive a professional degree in Landscape Architecture.

ENTRY QUALIFICATIONS

- Transcripts of your Academic Degree along with proof of relevant prior learning, for example portfolio of designed or built work, photographs, project drawings or writings
- Interview, in person or by Skype, that along with the other documentation, allows an
 applicant's level of knowledge to be identified along with a corresponding curriculum
 of learning.
- If English is not our native language, the minimum acceptable score on the TOEFL Internet Based Test is 100 and on IELTS it is 6.5
