When?

To help you maintain these relationships and to develop your ideas further you will be invited to join the Innovation Academy Alumni Network and LinkedIn to stay in touch by attending events.





Important Note

IA40310 Creative Thinking and Innovation (Module 1) and IA40340 Leadership Development (Module 2) consist of 10 days in class in total. Missing days can mean that successful completion of the module is not possible as students cannot catch up in their own time. Any absence must be by consent - of course there might be an emergency or illness, these things do happen just make sure to communicate with your facilitator if this arises.

Programme Structure and Deliverables

IA40310 Creative Thinking and Innovation (Module 1 - 5 ECTS)

The aim of this module is to help participants to access their innate ability for independent creative thinking and innovation in its broadest sense, as well as to help develop an entrepreneurial mindset in exploring ideas in a multidisciplinary team environment. This module is delivered through activity-based exercises and interactive challenges at both individual and group level. The module encompasses three primary areas of skill development and learning, as follows:

- Developing confidence in creative thinking. The objective is to introduce students to the inherent risk of failure in creative thinking and how to learn through prototyping and iteration.

 Participants are encouraged to use various sources of inspiration in recognizing opportunities and considering where ideas come from.
- Evolution of innovative ideas in multidisciplinary teams introduces team working in a creative context. Here, openness to new ideas and passion for ideas presented come into creative conflict. Several approaches to teamwork are introduced and explored to give participants an understanding of their own skills in relation to teamwork.
- How to translate ideas into value.
 We draw upon the Design Thinking
 framework in learning how to work
 through a process of understanding
 your user/customer, generating
 ideas, prototyping, and testing.
 Consideration is also given to the
 importance of being able to clearly
 define value and pitch an idea.

Attendance and participation in classroom challenges & exercises (70%) Self-reflection report (30%) (2 to 4 pages)

IA40340 Leadership Development and Creativity (Module 2 - 5 ECTS)

The Leadership Module introduces participants to the mindsets, skills and practical tools necessary to develop a creative leadership practice, one that cultivates a workplace culture where creativity and innovation flourish. To navigate challenges such as the sustainability crisis, technological disruption, changing working life and shifting global complexity, today's leaders require the mindsets, skills, and tools to seize opportunity and lead creative innovation. The World Economic Forum's Future of Jobs Report 2023 names Creative Thinking as among the top two most important skills for workers, recognising the importance of the ability to adapt to disruption. Attitudes such as empathy, active listening, leadership and social influence, are identified as key.

This module explores a new kind of leadership which unlocks creativity and innovation. On completion the learner should be able to:

- Unlock creativity in self, teams and workplaces
- Collaborate with others in ambiguous or unpredictable environments
- Cultivate skills for influencing, negotiating and creative problem solving
- Develop a capacity for self-awareness and self-reflection
- Build an ongoing creative leadership practice, act with creative confidence in the world.

Deliverables:

Attendance and participation in classroom challenges & exercises (40%) Presentation (30%) Self-reflection report (30%)

IA40210 Professional Practice (Action Learning Project -Innovation in the Worksplace) (Module 3 - 10 ECTS)

Participants will be given the opportunity to undertake independent project work in a professional environment, either as





an extension of their original Innovation Academy project proposal or on a project identified as directly deriving value from their field of interest. The project provides the opportunity to draw from prior learning around creative thinking and innovation and consider how it can be applied in their organisation and the real-world.

Delivered over 4 months, this Module combines project work, structured mentoring classes attended by all students, meetings and supportive peer mentoring sessions. Students undertake an individual or group project, approved by their facilitator, titled an 'Action Learning Project'. The module culminates in a final Action Learning Project presentation on 5 April 2024.

Deliverables:

Action Learning Project Report & Presentation (70%)
Self-reflection report (30%) (4 to 8 pages)

Note: Deliverables are mandatory for each module.



Fees, Student Card and Student Desk

Fees

The course is 100% funded for eligible job seekers, returners, carers and those who are formerly self-employed. It is 90% funded for eligible applicants who are employed or self-employed. Students who are 90% funded must pay 10% (€260).

The balance on your account will be reduced by either 90% or 100% accordingly. The full balance will remain on your account until you have reregistered on the HEA Springboard+ system about half way through the course and payment is made by the HEA.

If you are not eligible for Springboard+, the course fees are €2,600 (EU Citizens) | €5,200 (Non-EU Citizens) You can pay your programme fees by logging onto your SISweb account where you can make a payment using your debit/credit card. This is credited to your account straight away. Please ensure that you quote your student number as a reference:




Grades, Transcripts and Closing Event

Grades

Once you have uploaded your deliverables onto UCD BrightSpace, the facilitators will review and enter your grade on the UCD system. As part of the academic process, grades need to be ratified by the UCD Exam Board before final results are available. There are three periods where the university undertakes official processes to ratify all student grades - these take place in January, June and September (the end of each Trimester).

It is only at this point that you have officially completed the course. You will recieve an an email to your ucdconnect email to let you know that your results have been released and you can check them on the system.



Transcripts

For any students who have been funded through the HEA Springboard+ Initiative, the team will update their status from enrolled on springboardcourses.ie once grades are ratified. Please note - it is not possible to apply for another Springboard+ course while still enrolled on the Professional Diploma in Creativity, Innovation and Leadership and it is not possible to change the status until after grades have been ratified.


