Introduction

The Professional Diploma in Education Studies (PDES) programme is aimed at students who have an interest in deepening their knowledge of education matters and professionals working in areas related to education. The programme encourages students to engage broadly with education sciences and professional development.

On successful completion of the programme, students will:

- Have gained sufficient grounding in the theories and issues in the education world.
- Engage with concepts, principles, and values from a wide range of academic genres and

disciplines.

- Evidence an enhanced aptitude for continued self-directed learning as well as collaborative learning.
- Critically assess certain key theoretical, policy, and practical approaches to education as informed by the cognate disciplines of education and prevailing influences on educational practice.
- Have the ability to integrate knowledge and to reflect on wider disciplinary constructs in the course of their study.
- Develop appropriate academic writing and communication skills

Programme Highlight

Students can select from a broad range of interdisciplinary subjects or develop their own strand within the diploma, such as focusing on the area of Mental Health and Wellbeing.

Programme Structure and Content

The PDES is a 30-credit programme taken over one academic year part time. The programme enables students to engage broadly with education sciences and professional development or to develop their own strand within the diploma, such as Mental Health and Wellbeing.

Applicant Profile

- Candidates applying to this programme will normally hold an honours degree at undergraduate level (NFQ Level 8 or international equivalent) from a recognized higher education institution.
- We welcome international applicants and advise that applicants, whose first language is not English, should have an IELTS overall score of 6.5, with no band below 6, or equivalent. Only applicants who have met the English language results will be considered.
- This programme is only suitable for domestic(EEA) applicants. It is not suitable for international (Non EEA) applicants currently residing outside of the EEA Region.
