Master of Public Health (MPH) (One Year Full Time)

The Master of Public Health provides broad-based education and training in the basic disciplines which underlie the practice of Public Health. The perspectives and skills acquired will be of importance both to employers and employees. These skills are now becoming increasingly important as we face the challenges of providing appropriate, cost-effective and equitable health services for the 21st Century.

Students gain the ability to work as an active team member in planning, implementing, monitoring and evaluating health policy and the skills to assess the health status of populations. Students also develop an understanding of the organisation and financing of health services and their impact on population health.



Entry Requirements

- This programme is intended for registered medical and dental practitioners and for those with professional backgrounds in health or health care provision, who hold an appropriate primary degree. An upper second class honours, or international equivalent is required.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 7.0 (no band less than 6.5 in each element), or equivalent.
