MArchSc LANDSCAPE STUDIES (ONE YEAR FULL TIME)

This design studies programme confronts a wide range of contemporary landscape topics. Working on real-world place-based issues students deepen their knowledge of chosen subjects through personal projects and interdisciplinary team work. Past projects include policy design & visualisation, scenario building, masterplanning, spatial designs and representation as well as real-world interventions. Many classes are taught with Landscape Architecture, Planning, Urban Design and Architecture students.

UCD offers Ireland's only graduate degree programmes in Landscape Architecture and our teaching staff includes some of the country's top practitioners and academics.

This year-long programme of multidisciplinary study is mainly for graduates of landscape architecture, architecture and other design-based degrees but also accepts graduates of associated disciplines such as environmental studies, geography, planning and forestry.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A bachelor's degree with a minimum upper second class honours (NFQ level 8) or international equivalence in a relevant programme.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
