## Introduction

The School of Politics and International Relations offers an MA/MSc Politics degree, which was developed for those who wish to understand the role of politics in shaping the great issues of our day including power and conflict, distribution and inequality, relations between nations, and the new challenges of globalisation, financial crisis, national security, and climate change. The course focuses on the two traditional pillars of the discipline - political theory and comparative politics.

Comparative politics looks at the European nation-states in a comparative perspective. It analyses regime types, political stability, change and crisis, electoral and party systems. The courses build on expertise within the School on international development, political economy and public policy, ethnic conflict and nationalism, and European Union politics. Furthermore, the study of Irish politics in comparative context has deep roots at UCD.
