Career Opportunities

The degree qualifies students to work as library and information professionals in the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and throughout Europe. Recent graduates have dynamic careers as Chief Information Officers, Library Directors and Knowledge Managers.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants should present with a primary (bachelor's) degree in any subject with an overall score of 2.1 or higher.
- A minimum of 6 weeks' experience working in a library or information environment.
- Names and contact details of two referees who can assess their intellectual ability, maturity and motivation.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTS 6.5 (no band less than 6.0 in each element), or equivalent.
